DGS serves as business manager for the State of California. The Office of Fleet and Asset Management (OFAM) oversees the reutilization of state and federal surplus property and disposals of surplus property, among its other functions. Legislation and Executive Orders establish OFAM as a major state authority for asset management.

SURPLUS PROPERTY AND REUTILIZATION

The Surplus Property and Reutilization program is under DGS, OFAM, and is responsible for the proper disposal of all state-owned surplus personal property, vehicles, and other mobile equipment. The program works with the public and state agencies through various avenues.

STATE CONTROLLER'S OFFICE

The State Controller is the Chief Fiscal Officer of California. It is the state's independent fiscal watchdog, providing sound fiscal control over receipts and disbursements of public funds, offering fiscal guidance to local governments, and uncovering fraud and abuse of taxpayer dollars. The State Controller is authorized to perform field audits of all state agencies and their programs at its discretion, as directed by statute, or as requested by state agencies or the federal government to address fraud, waste, and abuse, and to produce revenue.

**CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF RESOURCES RECYCLING AND
RECOVERY (CalRecycle) 2805.4**
(February 2016)

CalRecycle is a state agency that provides information on the proper ways for waste reduction, recycling, and reuse. Its goal is to restore, protect, and enhance the environment, ensure public health, environmental quality, and economic vitality to California. CalRecycle works with state and local government agencies to help them achieve waste reduction, recycling, and environmentally preferable purchasing goals.
