

## **TYPES OF STATEMENTS**

(Sept. 1999)

The environmental effect statement required depends upon the effect the project will have upon the environment. Under the guidelines of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the statement will be limited to the following:

- Notice of Exemption: Activities adjudged to be categorically exempt per CEQA.
- Negative Declaration: Activities with no significant effect, change, or potential change to the environment.
- Environmental Impact Report: Activities with significant effect, change, or potentially substantial change to the environment.

## **FEES**

**3052.1**

All lead agencies preparing Negative Declarations for projects to be carried out by persons or entities other than the lead agency itself may charge and collect a reasonable fee from such persons or entities, in order to recover the estimated costs incurred in preparing the Negative Declaration.

For in-house projects, the costs for placement of ads of public notice or other minor expenses will be borne by the appropriate level. Sacramento Headquarters will account for the cost of CEQA from the project budget for projects performed by others and before funds are allocated to the Region for CDF performed Major Capital Outlay projects. Regions will address CEQA costs from the project budgets for Minor Capital Outlay projects. The cost for CEQA on Special Repairs projects will be addressed in funding provided to the Unit.
