(Sept 1999)

In addition to the narrative, visual aids are required to properly analyze the site and provide backup information for acquisition. See Exhibit 3324-3329 for checklist.

LAND BOUNDARY MAP

3329.1

(Sept 1999)

A map must be prepared showing all details of land use and ownership, including boundaries, easements, encroachments, setbacks, and accessibility from public road.

SITE SUITABILITY PLAN

3329.2

(Sept 1999)

The site suitability plan depicts existing topographic and cultural features on or adjacent to the site and presents a schematic layout of proposed site development.

QUADRANGLE

3329.3

(Sept 1999)

A USGS quadrangle sheet or other valid topographic map, at 1:24000 scale if possible, is utilized in the report and marked to show the following:

- The proposed site boundary outline.
- Proposed access road and alternative routes.
- Locations of nearby wells, if a well water supply is proposed.
- Monumented bench marks within a three-mile radius.
- Termination points or nearest main branch of utility company lines (to be provided for those points beyond the limits shown on the Site Suitability Plan).

PHOTO

3329.4

(Sept 1999)

Provide an 8" x 10" photograph of the site taken from the air. Use a marking pen to show the approximate site boundaries.

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

3329.5

(Sept 1999)

Impact on the environment for all proposed uses of the site must be considered. Prepare such an evaluation with an Environmental Impact Analysis (Refer to Section 3050, California Environmental Quality Act Compliance).
