





Salvage covers can be used to limit the vertical and horizontal spread of heat and smoke by curtaining off areas such as hallways and stairwells.





An improvised sump can be made by lashing together a combination of ladders and a pike pole. Some extension ladders may be partially disassembled to form two sides of the framework.



An improvised sump can provide a supply of water at a hydrant that has damaged threads or when fittings are unavailable for attaching hose.



Catch basins can be made from items found on scene such as chairs, tables, and stock. Arrange items in a circle large enough to contain the anticipated amount of water.



Spread a salvage cover over the arrangement; push cover down inside and lash the framework together to prevent the weight of contained water from pushing the framework apart.
