ESTABLISH AN OPEN AIRWAY, LAY VICTIM DOWN, ELEVATE LEGS 8-12 INCHES, PLACE BLANKET UNDER AND OVER VICTIM, TREAT CAUSE OF SHOCK, AVOID ROUGH HANDLING, NO DRINKS, MONITOR VITALS, SEEK MEDICAL HELP
