## **STATE FOREST DEFINITION**

(May 1988)

**5010.1**

The term "state forests" as used in this handbook refers to those lands owned by the State of California and held in the custody of the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection (CDF) as forest management demonstration forests for conservation purposes, including the production of forest products. The term "state forests" distinguishes such lands from other lands in the custody of CDF, principally those used for administrative purposes.

In normal dealings with the public, CDF employees should refer to Jackson, Latour, Mountain Home, and Boggs Mountain State Forests as "demonstration state forests." This point should be emphasized in any newspaper articles or handout materials developed for public distribution. Signs and posters should be changed accordingly. Referring to such units as "demonstration state forests," e.g., Jackson Demonstration State Forest, will help to engrain in the mind of the public and CDF employees that forest management demonstration is a major feature of the management of these properties.
