From time to time special projects may be initiated on state forests. Occasionally the Director will request the project and will furnish information and instructions regarding its preparation, conduct, and recording.

Special projects may involve such activities as establishing research plots or surveys, collecting seed, planting trees under various conditions, performing silvicultural thinnings, or preparing demonstration projects for education or training purposes.

Special projects which involve a considerable outlay in money or effort or which effect a considerable change in the appearance and use of the forest must be approved by the Director. Proposals for such projects should be submitted as a project plan ([see Section 5061.1](#)). The results may be published (see Section 5073).

Special projects must always be recorded and properly reported. In the absence of other instructions, the forest manager will automatically assume this responsibility.
