

## EMERGENCY RESPONSE

### Responsibility

#### All

CDF will keep CYA camp staff advised of current dispatch and get-away time requirements for fire crews. Get-away times for crews vary from immediate, to 30 minutes (during select-call staffing pattern for crews), to one hour for normal, after-hours get-away times. CYA staff will assure that those crews that are in camp at the time of dispatch are prepared and ready within the prescribed dispatch time and that adequate custody staff is available for dispatch.

When an emergency call is received for fire, flood, or rescue, and the crews are on work assignment, CYA shall be informed as to the dispatching of the crews and the location of the emergency.

When the crews are in camp, CYA will assemble the crews, and employees of both agencies will count the inmates onto the CCV's, trucks, or buses, at which time CDF assumes the custody of the wards. Should a CYA employee accompany the crew, custody of the wards is a mutual responsibility. Upon completion of the emergency assignment, all CCV's, trucks, and buses shall be randomly searched by both CYA and CDF prior to leaving the incident. Under no circumstances shall incident base equipment or supplies, except for properly secured lunches and other items normally carried, be allowed on the vehicle.
