

CDF FIXED-PRICE SALE OF RETIRED FIRE ENGINES

(January 1988)

Each fiscal year some 25 fire engines are retired from CDF's front line service. These engines are at least 15 years old and are no longer considered cost effective as initial attack, wildland fire control engines. It is, however, in the state's best interest to continue using these surveyed/replaced engines in fire service operations, either through reutilization within state service or by sale to other governmental agencies. DGS authorizes the following methods of disposal.

SEQUENCE OF DISPOSAL

Surveyed fire engines are turned in to the DEF in order to be

- Reutilized by CDF as a camp protection engine.
- Sold to another state agency.
- Offered to any governmental agency by means of a CDF single vehicle, fixed-price sale.
- Made available to the general public through CDF-conducted, competitive-bid, miscellaneous large-lot sale (see below).
- Made available to the general public through DGS-conducted competitive-bid single sale.

PRIORITY LIST

Surveyed fire engines are available to the following entities in this order:

- The conservation camp structural protection plan (for upgrade).
- Other state agencies.
- Legally organized fire departments, counties, municipalities, or other California government agencies for use on property within or abutting SRA.
- Legally organized fire departments, county municipalities, or other political subdivisions of California government with local responsibility areas.
- All other political or tax entities.

Surveyed fire engines not reutilized by a state agency will be offered to other governmental agencies through CDF-conducted, fixed-price, semiannual sales. Invitations to bid on these fire engines are mailed to all priority bidders on the current list.

The fixed price amount is jointly established for each fire engine by representatives of DGS and CDF. Because more than one bid may be received for any fire engine, the award is based on a bidder's priority. If two or more agencies with the same priority bid on a listed fire engine, the award is based on a lot drawing conducted by CDF.

All fire engines remaining unsold after the fixed price sale may then be sold either by a single sale administered directly by DGS or as part of a CDF miscellaneous sale, which is a competitive sealed-bid sale of all types of equipment held semi-annually by CDF. DGS authorizes these sales, which are conducted according to Government Code regulations for disposal of state-owned property.
