

## **CAL FIRE MAJOR INCIDENT MANAGEMENT REVIEW TEAM**

**7780**

(No. 14 September 1996)

The Department frequently deploys incident management teams to provide a more intense level of management using people trained and experienced in the specific tasks needed. As an extension of this process, the Department is implementing incident management review teams. The CAL FIRE Major Incident Management Review Team will review and analyze the management of major incidents to ensure that they are properly managed utilizing the Incident Command System, and to ensure accountability for the most efficient use of resources while the incident is in progress.

## **MAJOR INCIDENT MANAGEMENT REVIEW POLICY**

**7780.1**

(No. 14 September 1996)

The Director, region chief, or deputy director for Fire Protection will determine if a Major Incident Management Review Team is to be activated. A management review team will be considered when a major incident or multiple incidents are occurring in a geographic area or statewide and a CAL FIRE incident management team or teams have been deployed.

## **ADMINISTRATIVE GUIDELINES**

**7780.2**

(No. 14 September 1996)

Each Major Incident Management Review Team shall be issued an incident and request number.

Necessary costs, charges and expenses incurred as a result of the review will be closely monitored by the team leader, and an accounting will be maintained by an individual designated to do so. Fiscal responsibility for these expenditures will be as follows:

- Costs relative to the review of a CAL FIRE emergency fire incident are legitimate charges to the emergency fund.
- Costs and expenses incurred by a review team member, who is assigned to a review team for another agency, will normally be borne by the requesting agency.

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
