**PRE-ACCIDENT PLAN**

To minimize the time required to respond to an emergency and the possible loss of life caused by delays, it is important to have a plan prepared for dealing with various situations. Each base is responsible for developing a Pre-Accident Plan. This plan should be simple and readily available and be part of the Injury and Illness Prevention Program.

Pre-accident planning shall cover four general areas:

Crash-Alert Plan -How you should respond if you hear of an accident or emergency and you are not in a position to provide any direct aid. An example would be a planned response to receiving a telephone call that one of your aircraft has crashed.

Crash-Rescue Plan -How you would respond if an airplane crashed near your location and you have the capability of providing direct assistance.

Medical Procedures - A plan for the prompt and efficient use of helicopters, fixed-wing air ambulances, trained medical personnel and nearest hospital.

Immediate Notification Procedures - Involves accident reporting. Refer to accident/incident reporting instructions in this section.
