

## **INTRODUCTION**

The California Department of Forestry and Fire Protection's (CDF) fire prevention program interacts with the entire department programs and activities. The success of CDF's programs--including goals, objectives, and specific activities--is the responsibility of all employees. Program implementation occurs at the unit, ranger district/ battalion and fire station level with support and guidance provided by region and Sacramento fire prevention staff.

## **PROGRAM GOAL**

The goal of the fire prevention program is the prevention of ignition and spread of unwanted, human-caused fires with emphasis upon loss reduction and prevention of large, damaging fires.

## **PROGRAM OBJECTIVE**

**9001.2**

(No. 4, March 1991)

The department designs fire prevention activities to influence those who live, work, or recreate in the State Responsibility Area (SRA) to act in a fire safe manner and to reduce or eliminate physical fire hazards or risks. The intent is not to prohibit the use of fire, fire-risk agents, or equipment but to regulate the use of fire or potential ignition sources so that uncontrolled fires, as defined in Public Resources Code (PRC) 4104, do not occur.

## **AUTHORITY**

**9001.3**

(No. 4, March 1991)

The Public Resources Code grants authority for the CDF fire prevention program:

- PRC 4113 (Fire protection and prevention system established).
- PRC 4102 (Responsibility for prevention and suppression of wild fires on SRA).
- PRC 4114 (Fire prevention and suppression plan required).
