For this age group, fire prevention messages must be presented much differently than for elementary levels. Although fire station tours and some slide programs may be viable, more specialized programs should be considered. Career day programs are a good medium. A combination of career opportunity material, graphic displays, equipment displays and demonstrations, and fire prevention messages can be effective in reaching this group. Other possibilities include career opportunities to specialized classes such as forestry, the CDF role in state government as part of civics class, or a lecture on arsonists' profiles to a psychology class. The key to success is to direct your program to the students' interests and knowledge.

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
